Vermonters age 75 and older are now eligible to receive a FREE COVID-19 vaccine.

Dear community member,

Exciting news! As of Monday, January 25, Vermonters age 75 and older are invited to make a COVID-19 vaccine appointment. Vaccine clinics are conveniently located around the state and vaccines are free of charge.

Registering online at HealthVermont.gov/MyVaccine is the quickest way to make an appointment with the Vermont Department of Health. If that's not an option, you can also make an appointment by calling **(855) 722-7878**.

Please note that appointments can only be made through the Vermont Department of Health. If you have questions about the vaccine because of chronic conditions or medications, please discuss with your doctor or health care provider.

After everyone who is 75 years of age or older is vaccinated, the State will open vaccinations up to those 70 years of age and older, to be followed by those 65 years of age and older. This system of vaccinating our seniors will help protect our parents, grandparents, friends, and neighbors who are most at risk for serious illness from the coronavirus.

I have attached additional information including Frequently Asked Questions about the vaccines. If you are currently eligible for a vaccine and need assistance with registering for an appointment, your HCRS provider would be happy to help you.
